Prepare to use voice	1.1 Identify physical problems that can affect voice and discuss with required personnel ways to minimise their occurrence 1.2 Discuss with required personnel strategies for addressing problems with voice if they arise 1.3 Develop and use voice warm-up and warm-down routines for practice sessions and performances 1.4 Research and identify repertoire options that best fit own voice and selected vocal style

3. Perform pieces	3.1 Listen critically while singing and adjust intonation and musical techniques as required 3.2 Perform songs by memory and with melodic and rhythmic precision, attention to dynamic range and variations in techniques as required 3.3 Perform songs following agreed tempi and musical markings where required 3.4 Maintain correct posture, body position and care of voice in line with work health and safety (WHS) requirements 3.5 Enhance emotional content of songs in performance using vocal articulation, intonation and tone colours
4. Evaluate vocal technique development	4.1 Evaluate own performance and development of vocal techniques and note areas for improvement 4.2 Seek and use feedback from others and develop strategies for improving own performance and skill development

Foundation Skills

This section describes those language, literacy, numeracy and employment skills that are essential to performance but not explicit in the performance criteria.

SKILL	DESCRIPTION
Learning	Uses self-evaluation and input from others and devises strategies for improving own performance skills
Numeracy	Comprehends mathematical structure within musical pieces and interprets them according to musical conventions
Oral communication	- Participates in discussions using language specific to development of vocal techniques - Obtains information by listening and questioning

SKILL	DESCRIPTION
	Derives meaning from aural information
Reading	Comprehends the language of music and notation conventions
Planning and organising	Plans and completes tasks to achieve required standard of performance
Self-management	- Makes decisions related to own role and responsibilities - Evaluates feedback and decides on solutions and improvements
