Performance Evidence

The candidate must demonstrate the ability to complete the tasks outlined in the elements, performance criteria and foundation skills of this unit, including evidence of the ability to:

- proficiently conduct at least three different musical performances according to performance requirements.

In the course of the above, the candidate must:

- carry out pre-performance checks and warmups
- observe performance conventions and customs
- evaluate ensemble and own performance, incorporating feedback from others and considering improvement for future performances.

Knowledge Evidence

The candidate must be able to demonstrate knowledge to complete the tasks outlined in the elements, performance criteria and foundation skills of this unit, including knowledge of:

- procedures for interpreting and preparing a score for conducting
- music theory, technical and communication skills required by a conductor
- preparation, stage and performance conventions to be followed when conducting a performance
- issues that typically arise in context of conducting musical performances and strategies for overcoming them
- evaluation techniques and methods for reviewing of others and providing applicable feedback
- work health and safety (WHS) requirements and procedures in relation to conducting and performing.

Assessment Conditions

Skills in this unit must be demonstrated in a workplace or simulated environment where the conditions are typical of those in a working environment in this industry.

This includes access to:

- scores, charts and other written music resources required to demonstrate the performance evidence
- ensemble performers
- venue and audience for performances.

Assessors of this unit must satisfy the requirements for assessors in applicable vocational educational and training legislation, frameworks and/or standards.
