## Performance Evidence

The candidate must demonstrate the ability to complete the tasks outlined in the elements, performance criteria and foundation skills of this unit, including evidence of the ability to:

- apply hair, make-up and costuming for at least two performances.

In the course of the above, the candidate must:

- identify performance requirements with required personnel
- recreate hair and make-up designs on consecutive occasions
- meet production requirements promptly
- select, apply and remove hair and make-up products
- plan styles and colours of hair, make-up and costumes according to performance requirements
- follow work health and safety (WHS) procedures and policies.

## Knowledge Evidence

The candidate must be able to demonstrate knowledge to complete the tasks outlined in the elements, performance criteria and foundation skills of this unit, including knowledge of:

- WHS requirements in relation to preparing personal appearance for performances
- techniques for recreating hair and make-up designs on consecutive occasions
- impact of lighting on appearance of hair colour, skin tone and make-up
- roles and responsibilities of production personnel
- impact of ingredient in commonly used make-up and hair products on the skin
- techniques for determining and modifying own physical appearance to produce visual representation of the character being portrayed
- basic repair and maintenance techniques for different types of fabrics and costumes.

## Assessment Conditions

Skills in this unit must be demonstrated in a workplace or simulated environment where the conditions are typical of those in a working environment in this industry.

This includes access to:

- an environment in which different styles and designs for hair, make-up and costumes can be applied, modified, repaired and maintained within realistic timeframes
- products and equipment required for hair, make-up and costumes required for performances.

Assessors of this unit must satisfy the requirements for assessors in applicable vocational educational and training legislation, frameworks and/or standards.
