Application

This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to apply, colour and remove prosthetics for productions in the screen and entertainment industries. It requires developed technical skills in prosthetic design and preparation, and prosthetic maintenance and removal.

The unit applies to those who apply three-dimensional prosthetics appliances to performers for the creation of characters, such as ageing, look-alike, casualty and fantasy effects. Individuals must possess sophisticated interpersonal skills due to the lengthy application process of prosthetics and the extensive interaction with performers. The work can be done alone or with others.

No licensing, legislative or certification requirements apply to this unit at the time of publication.

Apply and maintain prosthetics	3.1 Determine positioning of prosthetics on performer according to production requirements 3.2 Apply prosthetics using materials, equipment and techniques that meet production requirements 3.3 Apply colour to prosthetics using products, equipment and techniques that meet production requirements 3.4 Evaluate application of prosthetics according to production requirements and adjust as required 3.5 Confirm personnel, products and equipment available for prosthetic maintenance according to production requirements 3.6 Maintain prosthetics according to production requirements and adjust as required
4. Remove prosthetic applications	4.1 Advise performer of prosthetic removal process according to production requirements 4.2 Remove prosthetic applications according to production requirements 4.3 Identify skin irritation or other problems and seek medical advice according to production requirements as required 4.4 Clean equipment and check work area is left in original or improved condition

Foundation Skills

This section describes those language, literacy, numeracy and employment skills that are essential to performance but not explicit in the performance criteria.

SKILL	DESCRIPTIONS
Numeracy	Calculates costings required for production
Oral communication	- Uses industry standard language and non-verbal features - Obtains information using listening and questioning techniques
Reading	- Analyses and interprets textual information from sources to determine special make-up and prosthetic requirements - Interprets production documentation in relation to own duties
Writing	- Develops material for and conveys explicit information to specific audiences using clear and detailed language - Completes workplace documentation according to requirements
Initiative and enterprise	- Makes decisions related to own role and takes responsibility for meeting production requirements - Generates and reflects on creative prosthetic ideas and concepts
Planning and organising	Plans, organises and implements required tasks and resources
Problem-solving	Responds to problems that arise according to production requirements
Self-management	Follows health and hygiene regulations and requirements when working with make-up application, removal processes and potential hazards
Teamwork	- Works collaboratively with required personnel throughout production - Follows accepted communication practices and protocols
