Performance Evidence

The candidate must demonstrate the ability to complete the tasks outlined in the elements, performance criteria and foundation skills of this unit, including evidence of the ability to:

- create a body of painting work according to at least two different ideas.

In the course of the above, the candidate must:

- research an extensive range of painting techniques to inform own work practice
- comply with intellectual property requirements
- handle equipment, tools and materials safely and minimise waste
- refine painting technique through a process of thorough experimentation and practice that:
 - shows a command of chosen techniques
 - demonstrates the development of an individual style
 - supports own ideas for work.

Knowledge Evidence

The candidate must be able to demonstrate knowledge to complete the tasks outlined in the elements, performance criteria and foundation skills of this unit, including knowledge of:

- specialised painting techniques, how they work to achieve effects and their limitations and constraints in achieving effects
- historical and contemporary influences applicable to refining painting techniques
- creative thinking techniques and how they can be used to encourage new ideas
- key safety requirements for painting work.

Assessment Conditions

Skills in this unit must be demonstrated in a workplace or simulated environment where the conditions are typical of those in a working environment in this industry.

This includes access to:

- equipment, tools and materials used to produce paintings
- information sources.

Assessors of this unit must satisfy the requirements for assessors in applicable vocational education and training legislation, frameworks and/or standards.
