Performance Evidence

Evidence of the ability to:

- interpret briefs for image capture work
- apply a range of image capture techniques
- use professional cameras and accessories to capture photo images according to the requirements of a brief
- organise a camera shoot from set up to pack up.

Note: If a specific volume or frequency is not stated, then evidence must be provided at least once.

Knowledge Evidence

To complete the unit requirements safely and effectively, the individual must:

- identify a range of professional camera systems and accessories, and explain their operations and functions
- describe image capture techniques for different purposes
- outline the capabilities of the range of camera exposure systems
- explain the use of lighting to create various effects in photographic image capture
- outline the styles and types of photographs or images that are required for different industry sectors
- identify work space requirements for photo image capture work, including selection and set up of work space for particular types of photo image capture
- outline issues that may arise in the context of photographic shoots, and how to deal with these
- summarise work health and safety and other legal requirements that may apply to photo imaging shoots.

Assessment Conditions

Assessment must be conducted in a safe environment where evidence gathered demonstrates consistent performance of typical activities experienced in creative arts industry environments. The assessment environment must include access to:

- professional cameras and accessories
- photographic materials
- suitable workspace.

Assessors of this unit must satisfy the requirements for assessors in applicable vocational educational and training legislation, frameworks and/or standards.
