Application

This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to seek ideas for own creative work by collecting and reviewing information; and then to use those ideas and creative techniques safely to develop that work. The creative work may be an oral, aural, visual or performance piece.

It applies to individuals who, with the help, feedback and supervision of key people, integrate ideas and techniques in any creative context to produce creative work in any form.
