### Performance Evidence

Evidence of the ability to:

- source information about location, characteristics and dimensions of potential sites for artwork or installation within required timeframe
- identify site characteristics that may affect planning work and determine their impact
- contribute to the planning process, selecting work options that are responsive to the characteristics of nominated site and creative work to be installed
- discuss and communicate ideas with others during planning process, using oral, visual and written means to convey intent
- document work processes using varied formats and according to required procedures.

Note: If a specific volume or frequency is not stated, then evidence must be provided at least once.

### Knowledge Evidence

To complete the unit requirements safely and effectively, the individual must:

- outline information needed about proposed sites when planning work and identify potential sources of this information
- describe key factors to consider when selecting artwork suitable for public spaces:
- describe procedures to be followed when sourcing site information from people external to the organisation.

### Assessment Conditions

Assessment must be conducted in a safe environment where evidence gathered demonstrates consistent performance of typical activities experienced in creative arts industry environments. The assessment environment must include access to:

- a site where work is being planned.

Assessors of this unit must satisfy the requirements for assessors in applicable vocational educational and training legislation, frameworks and/or standards.
