Application

This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to make the creative arts accessible to people with a disability. The intended focus is providing people with disability access to experience the creative arts.

It applies to individuals who work within the creative industry and require knowledge on making the arts accessible for people with disabilities, whether, this is the artists themselves or personnel within the organisation.
