Performance Evidence

The candidate must demonstrate the ability to complete the tasks outlined in the elements, performance criteria and foundation skills of this unit, including evidence of the ability to:

• perform on-camera for at least two different productions.

In the course of the above, the candidate must:

- follow direction
- · take account of camera focus and framing
- repeat sequences with accuracy
- work within the requirements of lighting, set location, sound and costumes
- maintain a consistently high level of performance when repeating sequences or performing them in a random order
- use screen industry terminology correctly.

Knowledge Evidence

The candidate must be able to demonstrate knowledge to complete the tasks outlined in the elements, performance criteria and foundation skills of this unit, including knowledge of:

- framing and camera angles in the context of performing to camera
- issues and challenges that typically arise when performing to camera and strategies to address them
- safe performance practices in relation to own performance genre
 - health and safety principles and procedures that performers need to observe when participating in film shoots
- strategies and equipment used to develop techniques
- tools and techniques used to analyse performances
- protocols for setting up and running a film shoot
- screen industry terminology
- impact of own role in contributing to broader performance goals.

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Assessment Conditions

Skills in this unit must be demonstrated in a workplace or simulated environment where the conditions are typical of those in a working environment in this industry.

This includes access to:

- opportunities to perform on-camera
- film shoot sets.

Assessors of this unit must satisfy the requirements for assessors in applicable vocational educational and training legislation, frameworks and/or standards.
