Performance Evidence

Evidence of the ability to:

- use casting and moulding techniques to produce a range of props that meet the requirements of at least two productions
- follow safety procedures
- meet work deadlines
- work collaboratively.

Note: If a specific volume or frequency is not stated, then evidence must be provided for each of the above points at least once.

Knowledge Evidence

To complete the unit requirements the individual must:

- describe the properties and applications of materials commonly used for casting and moulding
- provide reasons for the use of particular materials and techniques for different production requirements
- provide examples of different types of moulds
- describe issues and challenges that typically arise when using casting and moulding techniques to construct props, and suggest ways to address them
- describe safety and environmental issues associated with materials and equipment used in casting and moulding.

Assessment Conditions

Assessment must be conducted in a safe environment where evidence gathered demonstrates consistent performance of typical activities experienced in creative arts industry environments. The assessment environment must include access to:

- casting and moulding materials
- prop specifications.

Assessors of this unit must satisfy the requirements for assessors in applicable vocational educational and training legislation, frameworks and/or standards.
