Application

This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to make a range of prop furniture. The unit relates to the construction of furniture for use in a theatrical or event context and does not cover general furniture construction skills, which are found in MSF Furnishing Training Package.

The unit applies to those who work autonomously in a team environment as they take responsibility for ensuring that prop furniture meets the creative requirements of productions. They may be responsible for supervising others.

No licensing, legislative or certification requirements apply to this unit at the time of publication.

1. Prepare for prop furniture construction	1.1 Confirm prop furniture construction requirements with required personnel 1.2 Discuss factors that impact on the type of prop furniture required and plan accordingly 1.3 Analyse how items are to be used and decide most appropriate construction technique 1.4 Consider budget and other constraints when making decisions about constructing prop furniture 1.5 Prepare tools, equipment and materials according to construction plans

	1.6 Calculate quantities of required materials, avoiding waste where possible
2. Make prop furniture items	2.1 Create prop furniture items by following construction plans 2.2 Confirm requirements are met through active participation in discussion with required personnel 2.3 Construct prop furniture using the selected media, construction techniques and finishes
3. Complete prop furniture construction	3.1 Check furniture in terms of durability, quality of finish, and suitability for production requirements 3.2 Prepare items in readiness for finishing, according to production requirements 3.3 Follow safety procedures during the construction process and update documentation as required 3.4 Improve own work performance through evaluation of the construction process

Foundation Skills

This section describes those language, literacy, numeracy and employment skills that are essential to performance but not explicit in the performance criteria.

SKILL	DESCRIPTION
Learning	Improves own performance through seeking and comprehending the views of others
Reading	Interprets production documentation in relation to own duties
Writing	Updates workplace documentation
Oral communication	- Obtains information by listening and questioning - Expresses views using clear language
Numeracy	Performs simple calculations when taking measurements and checking that expenditure on prop furniture meets budget allocations
Self-management	- Takes responsibility for meeting health and safety requirements throughout the construction process - Takes responsibility for the outcomes of routine decisions related directly to own role - Takes account of a range of factors that impact on the process of making prop furniture

SKILL	DESCRIPTION
Teamwork	• Makes prop furniture by working collaboratively with others
Planning and organising	• Adopts a methodical and logical approach to the process of making prop furniture • Plans and organises own workload considering project timelines
