Performance Evidence

Evidence of the ability to:

- set priorities for scenic art maintenance tasks in line with production requirements
- follow instructions for repairing, altering and maintaining the condition of scenic art elements
- organise and store scenic art elements in line with production requirements
- meet work deadlines
- follow procedures for completing workplace documentation
- handle tools and materials in a safe manner
- collaborate with others to clarify and confirm alterations required.

Note: If a specific volume or frequency is not stated, then evidence must be provided at least once.

Knowledge Evidence

To complete the unit requirements safely and effectively, the individual must:

- outline roles and responsibilities of personnel involved in constructing sets and creating scenic art
- describe characteristics of a range of materials used in scenic art elements
- describe techniques for maintaining the condition of scenic art elements
- outline systems for storing and identifying scenic art elements
- explain health and safety standards that apply to using tools and hazardous materials for maintaining the condition of scenic art elements.

Assessment Conditions

Assessment must be conducted in a safe environment where evidence gathered demonstrates consistent performance of typical activities experienced in creative arts industry environments. The assessment environment must include access to:

- a work space and equipment to complete repairs and alterations to scenic art
- productions requiring scenic art elements
- interaction with others.

Assessors of this unit must satisfy the requirements for assessors in applicable vocational educational and training legislation, frameworks and/or standards.
