Application

This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to use a limited range of basic sculptural techniques to produce fundamental sculptures from simple design concepts.

The unit applies to those who have developed some general design, drawing or craft skills and who are now embarking on a career in visual arts. They have little or no experience in sculpture and work under close supervision and with guidance from others.

No licensing, legislative or certification requirements apply to this unit at the time of publication.

Test and use basic sculpture techniques	2.1 View a range of sculpture in different styles, and discuss with required personnel how effects are achieved 2.2 Match potential techniques to ideas for own sculptural work with assistance from required personnel 2.3 Assess effects of different sculpture techniques through experimentation with samples, practice pieces or works in progress

Review work to develop skills	3.1 Review own sculptural work and note areas for future improvement 3.2 Seek and consider feedback from required personnel when identifying areas of improvement in own work 3.3 Select credible options to review different sculptural works and develop sculpture skills

SKILL	DESCRIPTION
Learning	Builds own skills through a thorough, well-planned learning process
Reading	Interprets detailed information from required document formats
Oral Communication	- Clearly represents ideas for designs and techniques using industry-related terminology - Uses questioning and active listening techniques to gain information and seek feedback
Numeracy	Uses basic calculations when determining quantities of materials, dimensions of work space and art pieces
Self-management	Follows defined procedures, understands boundaries of own work and skill and seeks clarification and guidance where required
Teamwork	Seeks guidance and cooperates with instructions and advice from others
Planning and organising	- Makes routine decisions using required procedures - Resolves problems with technique through trial, error and practice
