Performance Evidence

The candidate must demonstrate the ability to complete the tasks outlined in the elements, performance criteria and foundation skills of this unit, including evidence of the ability to:

- construct soft scenery elements for at least two different productions.

In the course of the above, the person must:

- follow safety procedures throughout the set construction process
- produce soft scenery elements that are technically feasible and of a quality level that meets production requirements
- work collaboratively during set construction.

Knowledge Evidence

The candidate must be able to demonstrate knowledge to complete the tasks outlined in the elements, performance criteria and foundation skills of this unit, including knowledge of:

- features of different materials used for soft scenery construction, the context in which they are used and the reason for using them
- current technology used to construct soft scenery elements
- techniques used to construct different soft scenery items and the reasons for using them
- typical formats for technical drawings used in set construction plans and the way in which they are used during the process of constructing soft scenery items
- organisational safety requirements in relation to safe manual-handling techniques and working with hazardous substances.

Assessment Conditions

Skills in this unit must be demonstrated in a workplace or simulated environment where the conditions are typical of those in a working environment in this industry.

This includes access to:

- materials, tools and equipment required to construct soft scenery

- a work space in which construction can take place.

Assessors of this unit must satisfy the requirements for assessors in applicable vocational education and training legislation, frameworks and/or standards.
