Performance Evidence

The candidate must demonstrate the ability to complete the tasks outlined in the elements, performance criteria and foundation skills of this unit, including evidence of the ability to:

- prepare and edit at least two audio files that meet creative and technical production requirements.

In the course of the above, the candidate must:

- use editing software and equipment according to requirements, manipulating and applying effects as required
- digitise audio content in compatible formats
- assess and optimise quality of sound sequences
- mark, log and archive accurate edited sequences
- respond to feedback from others to improve own technical and creative performance.

Knowledge Evidence

The candidate must be able to demonstrate knowledge to complete the tasks outlined in the elements, performance criteria and foundation skills of this unit, including knowledge of:

- digital formats compatible with various editing processes, platforms and equipment
- key factors, purpose and procedures relating to industry terminology:
 - digital audio consoles
 - digital audio workstations (DAW)
 - digital signal processing
- procedures used to log and document edited sequences
- common challenges of collecting and organising content for broadcast and publication, and strategies to address them
- characteristics of sound that can be manipulated to achieve high quality output
- work health and safety requirements for working with sound.

Assessment Conditions

Skills in this unit must be demonstrated in a workplace or simulated environment where the conditions are typical of those in a working environment in this industry.

This includes access to:

- audio editing software and equipment
- manuals and instructions to support software and equipment
- audio content.
