Performance Evidence

Evidence of the ability to:

- develop a sound recording plan that clearly specifies all requirements
- set up recording equipment, conduct sound checks and make adjustments as required
- implement recording plan as part of a collaborative team
- produce a final sound recording and related documentation according to production requirements.

Note: If a specific volume or frequency is not stated, then evidence must be provided at least once.

Knowledge Evidence

To complete the unit requirements safely and effectively, the individual must:

- describe the information normally found in production documentation
- explain the principles of microphone operation and the techniques used in sound recording
- list and describe commonly used sound equipment, accessories and consumables
- explain the issues and challenges that typically arise when making sound recordings, and how to address them
- outline the work health and safety (WHS) principles relevant to sound recording.

Assessment Conditions

Assessment must be conducted in a safe environment where evidence gathered demonstrates consistent performance of typical activities experienced in creative arts industry environments. The assessment environment must include access to:

- sound equipment and accessories
- environments where sound is recorded
- relevant production documentation
- interaction with others.

Assessors of this unit must satisfy the requirements for assessors in applicable vocational educational and training legislation, frameworks and/or standards.
