Performance Evidence

The candidate must demonstrate the ability to complete the tasks outlined in the elements, performance criteria and foundation skills of this unit, including evidence of the ability to:

- operate flying systems for at least two different productions.

In the course of the above, the candidate must:

- follow safety procedures
- use communication systems according to organisational procedures and safety requirements
- use flying systems within their rated capacity
- work collaboratively with others involved in the production.

Knowledge Evidence

The candidate must be able to demonstrate knowledge to complete the tasks outlined in the elements, performance criteria and foundation skills of this unit, including knowledge of:

- issues and challenges that typically arise when operating flying systems that include the issues of dynamic and static forces, and solutions to address them
- link between flying and other aspects of productions and the range of elements that are commonly flown
- safety issues that impact on flying systems, including regulations about the scope of work that can be undertaken by unlicensed personnel and emergency procedures
- sequencing, timing and speed requirements for flying systems in a range of productions
- communication systems and correct signals to use when operating flying systems
- organisational procedures for operating flying systems

- industry standard automated flying systems and the key principles of their use
- counterweight systems, including:
 - loading and unloading cradles
 - safe working loads
 - single and double purchase
 - spreading the load
 - swinging bars
 - where to hang lighting bars and masking.

Assessment Conditions

Skills in this unit must be demonstrated in a workplace or simulated environment where the conditions are typical of those in a working environment in this industry.

This includes access to:

- venue in which a theatrical flying system is installed
- production that requires the operation of flying systems.

Assessors of this unit must satisfy the requirements for assessors in applicable vocational education and training legislation, frameworks and/or standards.
