Application

This unit describes skills and knowledge required to plan and supervise staging operations for productions in the live performance and events industries. It involves completing the planning process for specialist staging operations and managing the complete specialist staging operation.

The unit applies to those who display a high level of initiative, judgement and responsibility as they manage the operation of a wide range of staging equipment and effects, including high risk work associated with flying people and objects during performances.

The National Standard for Licensing Persons Performing High Risk Work applies to persons performing dogging, rigging, scaffolding work and operating elevating work platforms. Completion of the following units is required for certification and where applicable, at either basic, intermediate or advanced levels:

- CPCCLDG3001 Licence to perform dogging
- CPCCLRG3001 Licence to perform rigging basic level
- CPCCLRG3002 Licence to perform rigging intermediate level
- CPCCLRG4001 Licence to perform rigging advanced level
- CPCCLSF2001 Licence to erect, alter and dismantle scaffolding basic level
- TLILIC0005 Licence to operate a boom-type elevating work platform (boom length 11 metres or more).

Sets and staging for some performances or events may fall within the definition of construction work. If so, people entering a construction site are required to complete the general induction training program specified by the National Code of Practice for Induction for Construction Work (Commonwealth of Australia, 2007).

Achievement of the unit 'CPCCWHS1001 Prepare to work safely in the construction industry' fulfils this requirement.

2. Manage pre-show specialist staging operations	2.1 Confirm equipment and accessories are available and in safe working order 2.2 Organise staging personnel in line with industry award guidelines, including the services of licensed riggers as required 2.3 Contract services of flying effects companies as required, confirming adequate time is allowed for installation, training and rehearsals with flying systems 2.4 Collaborate with required personnel on required set modifications 2.5 Monitor progress of pre-show staging operations against work plans and implement contingency plans as required 2.6 Supervise staging aspects of technical and dress rehearsals and modify procedures as required 2.7 Develop and maintain production documentation as required
3. Manage show and post-show specialist staging operations	3.1 Monitor staging operations during performances and resolve problems as required 3.2 Supervise scheduled maintenance of staging equipment and accessories 3.3 Supervise bump out of staging elements 3.4 Involve required personnel in evaluation of staging

Foundation Skills

Self-management	- Works independently and collectively with a strong sense of responsibility for goals, plans, decisions and outcomes - Takes responsibility for meeting health and safety and other regulatory requirements within scope of own role - Applies organisational procedures when managing specialist staging operations
Teamwork	- Collaborates and achieves joint outcomes - Takes a leadership role
Planning and organising	- Develops plans and manages relatively complex, non-routine tasks in a methodical and logical way as required - Reviews progress against goals, adjusting plans and resources to cope with contingencies - Applies knowledge of staging equipment to work activities
Initiative and enterprise	Implements improvements based on outcome of evaluations of staging operations
Technology	Prepares production documentation using standard word processing applications
Problem-solving	Develops solutions according to production requirements
