Application

This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to develop and explore vocal techniques required for musical theatre performances.

The unit applies to those who are building vocal techniques associated with conveying meaning and emotion through effective delivery of spoken word and songs. The process includes supervision during practice sessions; however, individuals are expected to work individually at expanding their musical theatre performance techniques.
