Performance Evidence

The candidate must demonstrate the ability to complete the tasks outlined in the elements, performance criteria and foundation skills of this unit, including evidence of the ability to:

• operate industry-standard vision system equipment during at least two live productions.

In the course of the above, the person must:

- interpret and test running sheets
- follow safety procedures during run through, systems operations and power down
- work collaboratively with others to ensure production requirements and deadlines are met.

Knowledge Evidence

The candidate must be able to demonstrate knowledge to complete the tasks outlined in the elements, performance criteria and foundation skills of this unit, including knowledge of:

- key operational features, capacities and limitations of the vision system equipment required in performance evidence
- procedures for using the production areas of staging, lighting and sound in conjunction with vision systems
- issues and challenges that typically arise when operating vision systems and strategies to address them
- role and responsibilities of vision system technicians during live productions and events
- work health and safety requirements relating to operating vision systems, including:
 - licensing requirements for persons performing high risk work and entering building sites
 - safe manual-handling techniques
 - rigging procedures
 - working safely with electricity and hazardous substances.
