## Performance Evidence

Evidence of the ability to:

- write original storylines and treatments for media productions
- gather and synthesise ideas and concepts using a range of techniques
- apply effective narrative and structural techniques and appropriate formats to storylines and treatments
- prepare production materials for a story conference or pitch presentation
- evaluate narrative development and incorporate feedback to improve scripts
- work collaboratively with others to refine production material for client presentations.

Note: If a specific volume or frequency is not stated, then evidence must be provided at least once.

## Knowledge Evidence

To complete the unit requirements safely and effectively, the individual must:

- explain storytelling techniques appropriate to media productions
- describe key elements of narrative and techniques used to convey information in production material
- explain the steps in developing storylines
- outline health and safety requirements as they relate to working for periods of time on screens and keyboards
- outline typical challenges that arise when writing storylines and treatments and how to handle these.

## Assessment Conditions

Assessment must be conducted in a safe environment where evidence gathered demonstrates consistent performance of typical activities experienced in creative arts industry environments. The assessment environment must include access to:

- a production brief
- interaction with others
- software packages.

Assessors of this unit must satisfy the requirements for assessors in applicable vocational educational and training legislation, frameworks and/or standards.
