Performance Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence in this unit must be relevant to and satisfy all of the requirements of the elements and performance criteria on at least one occasion and include:

- applying colour coding, markings, stencilling and labels
- applying compatibility/environmental constraints
- applying moisture absorption/sealing procedures
- applying operational safety
- calculating weight, volume and dimensions
- identifying explosives and packaging materials
- using relevant tools and equipment.

Knowledge Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence in this unit must be relevant to and satisfy all of the requirements of the elements and performance criteria and include:

- basic knowledge of
 - effects of environmental conditions
 - heat and/or vacuum sealing/moisture absorption/packaging procedures
- operational knowledge of
 - colour coding, markings, stencilling and labelling requirements
 - documentation requirements
 - explosives to be packaged
 - operation and limitations of packaging tools and equipment

- operational safety
- unit load construction
- weight volume and dimension calculations
- work condition class.

Assessment Conditions

Assessors must hold credentials specified within the Standards for Registered Training Organisations current at the time of assessment.

Assessment must satisfy the Principles of Assessment and Rules of Evidence and all regulatory requirements included within the Standards for Registered Training Organisations current at the time of assessment.

Assessment must occur in workplace operational situations. Where this is not appropriate, assessment must occur in simulated workplace operational situations that reflect workplace conditions.

Assessment processes and techniques must be appropriate to the language, literacy and numeracy requirements of the work being performed and the needs of the candidate.

Resources for assessment must include access to:

- a range of relevant exercises and case studies and/or simulations
- acceptable means of simulation assessment
- applicable documentation, including workplace procedures, regulations, codes of practice and operation manuals
- relevant materials, tools, equipment and PPE currently used in industry.
