Assessment Requirements for DEFFOR021 Produce a digital media image for forensic purposes

Release 1. This is the first release of this unit of competency in the DEF Defence Training Package.

Performance Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence in this unit must be relevant to and satisfy all of the requirements of the elements and performance criteria on at least one occasion and include:

- adhering to operational safety
- applying exhibit handling skills
- applying resource management and time management
- collecting, packaging and preserving specific evidence types
- maximising the potential evidentiary value of the digital evidence
- preserving continuity of evidence
- using analytical, decision-making and problem-solving skills in response to a range of digital evidence contexts, including the systematic examination of items of digital evidence
- using specialised evidence-recording software or equipment as required.

Knowledge Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence in this unit must be relevant to and satisfy all of the requirements of the elements and performance criteria and include knowledge of:

- application and potential limitations of forensic investigative techniques
- legislative, policy and quality system context
- required forensic documentation for the recording and collection of digital evidence
- roles and functions of other forensic discipline specialists
- the range of techniques available for the recording, collection, packaging and preservation of digital evidence
- work health and safety (WHS) practices to be followed when producing a digital media image for forensic purposes.

Assessment Conditions

Assessors must hold credentials specified within the Standards for Registered Training Organisations current at the time of assessment.

Assessment must satisfy the Principles of Assessment and Rules of Evidence and all regulatory requirements included within the Standards for Registered Training Organisations current at the

time of assessment.

Assessment must occur in workplace operational situations. Where this is not appropriate, assessment must occur in simulated workplace operational situations that reflect workplace conditions.

Assessment processes and techniques must be appropriate to the language, literacy and numeracy requirements of the work being performed and the needs of the candidate.

Resources for assessment must include access to:

- a range of relevant exercises, case studies and/or simulations
- applicable documentation, including workplace procedures, regulations, codes of practice and operation manuals
- relevant materials, tools, equipment and personal protective equipment (PPE) currently used in industry.
