Performance Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence must satisfy all of the requirements of the elements and performance criteria. If not otherwise specified the candidate must demonstrate evidence of performance of the following on at least one occasion.

- achieving the required effects of fire
- applying battle craft
- applying fieldcraft skills
- · applying recognised safety precautions
- handling weapons in an operational environment
- following fire control orders
- working in a team
- conducting the following weapon drills:
 - checking clearances
 - degrees of weapon readiness
 - immediate action and stoppage
 - safety precautions
 - stripping and assembling
- firing the weapon using, as a minimum, ball ammunition
- applying engagement techniques including at least one of:
 - fix
 - destruction
 - neutralisation
 - rates of fire
 - suppression
- recognising limit of own authority

Knowledge Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence must satisfy all of the requirements of the elements and performance criteria. If not otherwise specified the depth of knowledge demonstrated must be appropriate to the job context of the candidate.

- battle craft
- characteristics, technical capabilities, effects, employment and limitations of the service rifle and ammunition
- fieldcraft
- fire control orders
- WHS requirements
- recognised safety precautions
- weapon drills

Assessment Conditions

Competency should be assessed in an actual workplace or in a simulated environment, with access to equipment and infrastructure appropriate to the outcome. Competency should be demonstrated over time to ensure the candidate is assessed across a variety of situations.

The service rifle operator must be able to achieve the organisational standard of operation and marksmanship, in Defence stipulated in Training the Battle Shot Stage 5; MLW 2 9 1Training the Battle Shot.

Assessors must satisfy the NVR/AQTF mandatory competency requirements for assessors.
