Technology

- conduct equipment maintenance

- maintain equipment such as a weapon, survey equipment or meteorological equipment for serviceability
- ensure targets are sighted and tracked using the system
- prepare and operate a radar or weapon
- safely handle, aim, fire, manoeuvre and maintain line of sight ground based air defence weapon systems
- use ammunition under supervision
- use communications and signalling devices
- use emergency devices (e.g. parachute, life-raft) and weapons
- use equipment/instruments including ancillary equipment or survey equipment
