Communication	<p>Defence qualifications have core units (which must be achieved) and elective units (where there is a choice of units which must be achieved) so different Employability Skills Summaries are possible within the one qualification, depending on the package of core units and chosen elective units.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • access, interpret and rehearse fire emergency procedures • access, read and interpret local emergency procedures • adjust own communication styles to reflect equity and diversity • apply appropriate techniques when providing constructive feedback to other team members, and giving and receiving support to/from team members • apply interpersonal and cross-cultural communication strategies • apply non operational and operational communication processes • communicate en-route and arrival, reporting information • comply with range safety brief and practice brief • detect and report sign • direct driver • ensure communication is achieved through non-verbal signals • ensure that information, knowledge and skills are communicated effectively and shared • ensure written communication is to a level required to complete workplace forms and reports • follow indicated route • follow legislative and statutory requirements • follow standard procedures, safety procedures, instructions, organisation policies and guidelines • identify and rectify defects, within limits of authority or report to supervisor • identify, confirm and report the nature and scope of the fire • prepare navigation records • receive and apply orders and send and receive simple non-verbal signals • receive and clarify (where required) security operation orders

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • recognise and report breaches of organisational codes of ethics and/or practice and statements of values • report unanticipated access difficulties • use record of proposed route and navigation aids • use verbal and non-verbal communication techniques including language style, active listening • usually operate under direct orders for opening fire
Teamwork	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • adhere to formations • assist in the completion of tasks when requested by other teams members and is appropriate • contribute to identifying team goals and objectives • encourage and acknowledge participation by team members • guide and facilitate teams • recognise and apply equity and diversity principles • recognise, value and adjust own behaviour to individual differences in the workplace by treating others with respect and dignity • seek support where required to enable identification and implementation of positive alternatives to personal problems • share and communicate effectively between team members, information, knowledge and skills relevant to work • understand principles of teamwork and team's aims and objectives • undertake surveillance patrols as part of a team • work in an acceptable and non-discriminatory manner while establishing rapport and good working relationships with all colleagues • work under supervision and usually as part of a team • work with others and make a positive contribution to the effectiveness and efficiency of a team
Problem solving	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • apply immediate action and stoppage drills • apply navigational techniques • assess a fire situation and determine an appropriate course of action • carry out patrol rehearsals • conduct patrol drills and procedures • continually assess the environment to identify the threat or their sign • effectively react to changes in the operating environment necessitating re-planning of course • extinguish fires • identify and engage targets • identify and rectify defects within limits of authority

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • identify weaknesses exploitation • interpret cartographic information, navigation techniques, local and environmental conditions • minimise personal signature • navigate to destination • select the type of camouflage required for a particular situation, and detect the capabilities of the threat
Initiative and enterprise	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • use improvised techniques appropriately such as minimising personal signature
Planning and organising	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • apply bayonet fighting drills • assess a tactical situation so that appropriate camouflage and concealment techniques can be applied • assess factors influencing camouflage and concealment • assess the environment so that appropriate camouflage and concealment techniques can be applied • assess threat's detection capabilities • conduct weapon drills • demonstrate understanding of, and apply throughout operation, occupational health and safety requirements and recognised safety precautions including those contained in the Australian Defence Force procedures • determine and plan a safe route • determine current location, destination and resources • gather and check relevant maps and navigation equipment • prepare for patrolling • select appropriate routes
Self-management	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • commit to the jurisdiction's laws and the organisation's policy procedures • comply with workplace equity and diversity practices • conduct self in a manner that shows sensitivity to the differences between colleagues • ensure personal preparation is carried out • identify, plan and implement personal development strategies • model and maintain high standards of personal performance, ethics and integrity • monitor and manage personal physical and emotional health • recognise limit of own authority • review, monitor and self-assess own performance • regularly seek formal and informal performance feedback
