Unit Descriptor

This unit covers the competency required to supervise and control all aspects of the operation of direct fire support weapons.

No licensing, legislative, regulatory or certification requirements apply to this unit at the time of publication. In a Defence context, this means that there is no civilian need to hold this unit in order to meet licensing, legislative, regulatory or certification requirements.

Application of the Unit

This competency was developed for combat arms personnel required to supervise and control all aspects of direct fire support weapons in a deployed operational environment but is applicable to any individual in this field of work.

Typically supervisors work independently and lead a team under direct and/or indirect supervision, use discretion and judgement, and take responsibility for the quality of their outputs.

All activities are carried out in accordance with relevant organisational policies and procedures.

3. Ensure direct fire support weapons are maintained	 3.1 Operator maintenance activities are supervised. 3.2 Reported defects are rectified within limits of authority or reported to supervisor. 3.3 <i>Maintenance</i> activities are completed in accordance with standard procedures.
