- 1.2 *Relevant instructions* are identified, obtained and agreed in accordance with Range Standing Orders
- 1.3 Purpose and outcomes of visit are clarified and agreed in accordance with Range Standing Orders
- 1.4 Clearances and access to activities are established in accordance with Range Standing Orders
- 2.1 Training area and range activities are monitored in accordance with Range Standing Orders and relevant instructions
- 2.2 Training activity compliance with Range Standing Orders, relevant policy and instructions is monitored
- 2.3 Contractor activities are monitored in accordance with Range Standing Orders and relevant controls
- 3.1 Non-compliant training activities are identified and non-compliance is indicated to relevant commanders
- 3.2 Training area and range users are *briefed* in accordance with Range Standing Orders and relevant instructions
- 3.3 Coordination issues are resolved, if necessary through direct contact and discussions
- 3.4 Access and egress is controlled in those circumstances where required
- 3.5 Coordination and compliance between users and landholders is established on non-Defence property
- 4.1 Post exercise reports are raised when appropriate in accordance with Range Standing Orders and relevant instructions
- 4.2 Non-compliance reports are initiated and forwarded to relevant authorities in accordance with Range Standing Orders and relevant contracts

Required Skills and Knowledge

This describes the essential skills and knowledge and their level, required for this unit.

- access, interpret and apply range and other instructions and policy
- access, interpret and apply Range Standing Orders
- apply interpersonal techniques
- · communicate verbally and in writing
- control access and egress to ranges and training areas

- retain and apply information from briefings
- write at the level required to complete post exercise and non-compliance reports

Critical aspects for assessment and evidence required to demonstrate competency in this unit	Assessment must confirm the ability to plan and prepare when monitoring a training area and range activities, to evaluate compliance of training area and range activities, and to control training area and range activities.
	Consistency in performance
	Competency should be demonstrated in a range of actual or simulated range and training area management contexts.
Context of and specific	Context of assessment
resources for assessment	Competency should be assessed in the workplace or in a simulated work environment, in accordance with all relevant legislation and organisation requirements.
	Specific resources for assessment
	Access is required to an operating range and training area.
Guidance information for assessment	In all cases assessment should be supported by questions to assess knowledge and those aspects of competency which are difficult to assess directly.
	Questioning techniques should suit the language and literacy levels of the candidate.

Range Statement

The Range Statement relates to the Unit of Competency as a whole. It allows for different work environments and situations that may affect performance. *Bold italicised* wording in the Performance Criteria is detailed below.

A range may include:	All air, land and/or sea areas used for Defence live-firing weapons practices, tests or operations
A training area may include:	• Any area of land, sea, undersea, or air used for any military manoeuvres or simulated wartime operations involving planning, preparation and execution, carried out for the purpose of training and evaluation
