Performance Evidence

An individual demonstrating competency must satisfy all of the elements and performance criteria in this unit.

There must be evidence that the individual has identified key stages and beer production equipment in at least one brewery, including:

- identifying the stages in the brewing process and how the stages relate to each other
- identifying equipment in the brewery
- identifying at least four health and safety risks within the brewery, and how each is controlled.

Knowledge Evidence

An individual must be able to demonstrate the knowledge required to perform the tasks outlined in the elements and performance criteria of this unit. This includes knowledge of:

- the range of products and services that the brewery produces
- key functions and processes within the workplace, including storage of raw materials, preparation of grain, yeast management, wort production, cellar operations, bottling and packaging
- key legal requirements of beer production
- how each function or process contributes to product and services quality
- key health and safety risks in a brewery, and how they are controlled
- own workplace and site layout, roles and responsibilities
- features and purpose of key equipment and work areas
- roles of key staff members and responsibilities within the brewery
- reporting procedures and processes for key stages and beer production equipment in a brewery
- workplace information sources, and updating and accessing of requirements and procedures.

Assessment Conditions

Assessment of the skills in this unit of competency must take place under the following conditions:

- physical conditions:
 - a brewery or an environment that accurately represents workplace conditions
- specifications:
 - work procedures, instructions and general workplace information.

Assessors of this unit must satisfy the requirements for assessors in applicable vocational education and training legislation, frameworks and/or standards.
