1	<p>Replaces equivalent unit FPICOR4201B Monitor safety, health and environment policies and procedures, which was first released with FPI11 Forest and Forest Products Training Package Version 2.2. This is the first release of this unit in the new standards format.</p> <p>Assessment requirements now specify the performance and knowledge evidence, as well as assessment conditions for this unit of competency. These sections simplify and replace components used in the previous unit format, including Required Skills and Knowledge, Evidence Guide and Range Statement.</p>

Performance Evidence

A person demonstrating competency in this unit must satisfy all of the elements, performance criteria and foundation skills of this unit. If a specific volume or frequency is not stated below, then evidence must be provided that the following requirements have been performed on at least one occasion:

- follow organisational policies and procedures relevant to monitoring SHE policies and procedures
- monitor SHE policies and procedures within the organisation
- monitor safe and healthy working conditions
- assess environmental measures within the organisation.

Knowledge Evidence

A person competent in this unit must be able to demonstrate knowledge of:

- applicable Commonwealth, State or Territory legislation, regulations, standards, codes of practice and established safe practices relevant to the full range of processes for monitoring SHE policies and procedures
- environmental protection requirements, including the safe disposal of waste material
- organisational and site standards, requirements, policies and procedures relevant to monitoring SHE policies and procedures
- community issues in relation to the environment
- lessons learnt after an emergency
- environmental risk and hazard identification
- assessment and control of risks

- emergency procedures
- environmental management systems
- procedures for recording and reporting workplace information.

Assessment Conditions

The following resources must be made available:

- organisational policies and procedures relevant to safety, health and environment
- relevant personnel for the purposes of communicating information

Competency is to be assessed in the workplace or a simulated environment that accurately reflects performance in a real workplace setting.

Assessor requirements

Assessors must:

- hold the appropriate assessor competency standards as outlined in regulations; and
- be able to demonstrate vocational competencies at least to the level being assessed; and
- be able to demonstrate how they are continuing to develop their VET knowledge and skills as well as maintaining their industry currency and assessor competence.
