Application

This unit describes the required skills and knowledge to assess whether clients are misusing alcohol and/or other drugs and implement a care plan under direction or within established guidelines that limit discretion.

This unit applies to Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander Health Workers working as part, and under the supervision, of a multidisciplinary primary health care team to provide a range of primary health care services to Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander clients and communities.

The skills in this unit must be applied in accordance with Commonwealth and State/Territory legislation, Australian/New Zealand standards and industry codes of practice.

- 3.2 Ensure follow-up action is in line with community, legislative and organisation guidelines
- 3.3 Refer client to appropriate services in line with individual and community needs and organisation guidelines
- 3.4 Monitor the follow-up plan and record outcomes
