Application

2. Prepare action plan

2.1 Ensure project plan identifies required actions and resources

2.2 Document plan and discuss with other workers

2.3 Identify project risks and assess likelihood and impacts

3. Implement and evaluate project

3.1 Follow project plan and review in operation to address identified community needs

3.2 Ensure community is kept informed of progress on the project

3.3 Discuss project outcomes with supervisors and the community

3.4 Reflect on project recommendations with the supervisor and community

3.5 Document project outcomes

3.6 Evaluate project outcomes and document results
