- 3. Construct custom impression tray
- 3.1 Apply appropriate separating medium in accordance with manufacturer's instructions
- 3.2 Mix or manipulate materials in accordance with the manufacturers' instructions
- 3.3 Adapt tray material to the model to the pre-determined peripheral outline
- 3.4 Construct handle and attach according to operator requirements
- 3.5 Process custom tray using the correct method for the correct material
- 3.6 Separate the tray from the model in a manner that prevents damage and remove spacer material
- 3.7 Trim the outline of the tray to shape

- 4. Finish custom impression 4.1 Smooth and refine the peripheries, handle and other surfaces of the tray
 - 4.2 Decontaminate the custom impression tray according to infection control guidelines
 - 4.3 Dry the custom tray and place in a sealed container for dispatch
