3. Construct registration rim

- 3.1 Construct rim to industry standard in selected material
- 3.2 Trim rim to prescribed dimensions and appropriate landmarks
- 3.3 Smooth and polish rim according to material chosen
- 3.4 Decontaminate the registration rim according to infection control guidelines
- 3.5 Dry the registration rim and place in a sealed container for dispatch
