### Application

This unit describes the performance outcomes, skills and knowledge required to apply contemporary wound management principles to the care of persons with various types of wounds. It involves working with the registered nurse within the multidisciplinary health care team to contribute to the assessment, treatment and ongoing management of wounds.

This unit applies to enrolled nursing work carried out in consultation and collaboration with registered nurses, and under supervisory arrangements aligned to the Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia (NMBA) regulatory authority legislative requirements.

The skills in this unit must be applied in accordance with Commonwealth and State/Territory legislation, Australian Standards and industry codes of practice.

No occupational licensing, certification or specific legislative requirements apply to this unit at the time of publication.

Apply requirements of wound healing phase of haemostasis.</p> <p>2.9. Apply requirements of preventative wound care strategies to develop and implement the wound care plan.</p> <p>2.10. Apply contemporary assessment techniques to implement wound care strategies, in accordance with national standards and organisational policies and procedures.</p> <p>2.11. Access and prepare wound dressing products as required in the wound management plan for the identified phase of wound healing.</p> <p>2.12. Dispose of used articles including hazardous waste according to organisational policies and procedures.</p> <p>2.13. Make the person comfortable and complete required wound management documentation.</p>
3. Assess and document wound and wound care plan.	<p>3.1. Assist assessment of the wound using medical terminology.</p> <p>3.2. Apply requirements of the physiological and biochemical processes associated with normal wound healing when assessing wounds.</p> <p>3.3. Identify factors that impact on wound healing including psychosocial impact of a wound.</p> <p>3.4. Identify common problems and complications of wounds.</p> <p>3.5. Document the wound care plan.</p> <p>3.6. Apply universal precautions and infection control principles to the wound care plan.</p>
4. Apply wound management strategies to wounds.	<p>4.1. Apply requirements of wound complexity and the pathological processes of wound healing for wounds.</p> <p>4.2. Identify common problems and complications of wounds.</p>

	<p>4.3. Adhere to aseptic technique in the application of wound care.</p> <p>4.4. Adhere to aseptic technique to remove wound sutures, surgical clips and to shorten and remove wound drains.</p> <p>4.5. Participate in the development, review and assessment of individualised wound plans.</p>
<p>5. Assist in evaluating outcomes of nursing actions.</p>	<p>5.1. Involve person and carer in assessment process.</p> <p>5.2. Monitor responses to wound management strategies, and progress towards planned wound management goals.</p> <p>5.3. Assess, document and communicate progress of wound healing and wound care strategy outcomes using contemporary wound management terminology.</p> <p>5.4. Assist in assessing wound management strategies and products used.</p> <p>5.5. Communicate assessment findings for modified and alternative wound management strategies, procedures and goals for the person.</p> <p>5.6. Work within a cost-effective framework for wound management.</p> <p>5.7. Identify, plan and apply health education and promotion strategies to wound management.</p>
