Undertake risk assessment, using recognised risk assessment methodology, under supervision of a registered nurse to develop the plan of care for the person.</p> <p>3.2. Participate in multidisciplinary health care team meetings to ensure resources and approaches used in care planning meet individual and group needs.</p> <p>3.3. Observe and document the person's behaviour and identify signs and symptoms of reduced physical health and changes to behaviour.</p> <p>3.4. Provide health promotion and educational strategies in accordance with organisational policies and procedures in response to signs and symptoms of reduced physical health.</p> |
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- 3.5. Apply recovery principles to nursing care with support from multidisciplinary health care team to maximise health outcomes for individuals and groups.
4. Contribute to recovery of a person with a mental health condition.
 - 4.1. Plan, prioritise and implement nursing interventions with the person, registered nurse, multidisciplinary health care team and the person's families and carers.
 - 4.2. Respect the person's dignity and uniqueness and use strategies to encourage their contribution to their own plan of care.
 - 4.3. Assist the person, families and carers to participate in therapeutic interventions.
 - 4.4. Confirm the person understands the use, administration methods and possible effects of medications including known adverse effects.
 - 4.5. Advise the person, families and carers about community resources and opportunities and adapt the advice to the individual needs of the person.
 - 4.6. Support the person as a valued member of the community to build on their own strengths and to take as much responsibility as possible for decisions that affect their lives.
 - 4.7. Identify and apply principles of contemporary, evidenced-based nursing practice that reflect recovery-oriented care for a person who has a mental health condition.
