 - 3.2. State the dosage that has been prescribed.
 - 3.3. Explain the steps required to ingest and apply the prescribed medication.
 - 3.4. Explain the route for administering the medication.
 - 3.5. Explain the storage requirements of the medication and how to dispose of used or remaining unused portion of the medication.
 - 3.6 Identify the signs which would warrant referral to an authorised person when required.
 - 3.7. Utilise appropriate techniques to confirm patient understanding of the uses and actions of the medication.
 - 3.8. Identify patients having difficulty using, taking and actuating their prescribed medication and provide further assistance or refer the patient if required.
