Application

This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to ensure that repairs and maintenance are undertaken for functional and durable health hardware.

This unit applies to work in a public health context and workers at this level will work under supervision and within defined guidelines.

Plumbing work must only be performed by a person authorised by registration or licence granted by the relevant state or territory regulatory authority under legislation.

The skills in this unit must be applied in accordance with Commonwealth and State/Territory legislation, Australian/New Zealand standards and industry codes of practice.

- 2. Address issues in accordance with job role
- 2.1 Develop a work plan in conjunction with supervisor to address identified gaps and repairs
- 2.2 Seek advice and/or support from key people and outside agencies
- 2.3 Implement follow-up procedures to ensure identified repairs are being adequately addressed
- 2.4 Report follow-up procedures to supervisor as required in accordance with established procedures
