Performance Evidence

The candidate must show evidence of the ability to complete tasks outlined in the elements and performance criteria of this unit, manage tasks and manage contingencies in the context of the job role. There must be demonstrated evidence that the candidate has:

- developed and documented at least 2 population health project plans that each address a different health issue including the determination of:
 - scope, goals, objectives and strategies
 - resources, timeframes and budgetary requirements
 - evaluation scope, purpose, method and measures
 - process for disseminating and obtaining approvals.

Knowledge Evidence

The candidate must be able to demonstrate essential knowledge required to effectively complete tasks outlined in the elements and performance criteria of this unit, manage tasks and manage contingencies in the context of the work role. This includes knowledge of:

- legal and organisation requirements relating to planning a population health project, including:
 - equity issues in population health
 - evidence-based practice
 - social change and advocacy processes

- relevant international charters and/or declarations and documents
- national, State/Territory and local health policies, goals, targets and priorities
- organisation standards, policies and procedures, including scope of own role and responsibilities
- project planning principals and models
- stages in population health project planning
- aspects of population health project planning, including communication strategies, quality assurance and budgeting
- theory and fields of population health, including:
 - health promotion
 - environmental health
 - communicable diseases
 - health risk management and assessment
- methods of monitoring and recording aspects of project implementation, including reach and/or exposure, acceptability and/or satisfaction and quality of materials
- consultation and participation techniques.

Assessment Conditions

Skills must have been demonstrated in the workplace or in a simulated environment that reflects workplace conditions. Where simulation is used, it must reflect real working conditions by modelling industry operating conditions and contingencies as well as using suitable facilities, equipment and resources.

Assessors must satisfy the Standards for Registered Training Organisations (RTOs) 2015/AQTF mandatory competency requirements for assessors.
