This qualification has been structured to include coverage of specific requirements for ambulance work and for medical assisting work in the Australian Defence Force (ADF). This qualification is suited to Australian Apprenticeship pathways.

- Voluntary (or paid) ambulance work
 First aid provider
- Medical assistant (Defence)

The importance of culturally aware and respectful practice
