Performance Evidence

Evidence of the ability to:

- interpret basic requirements of a design brief
- use digital media package to meet organisational requirements
- apply workplace health and safety (WHS) principles and responsibilities for ergonomics, such as work periods and breaks
- use help manuals and online help when appropriate
- use digital media technologies to support design brief requirements.

Note: If a specific volume or frequency is not stated, then evidence must be provided at least once.

Knowledge Evidence

To complete the unit requirements safely and effectively, the individual must:

- explain the basic principles of visual design
- outline the functions and features of digital media packages and technologies
- identify graphic design and stylistic language conventions
- outline WHS principles and responsibilities for ergonomics, such as work periods and breaks
- outline the principles of digital imaging and file formats, video and sound file formats, file management and transfer systems
- identify vendor product directions in digital media hardware and software
- explain how to visualise and interpret creative information, scripts (text) and images.

Assessment Conditions

Gather evidence to demonstrate consistent performance in conditions that are safe and replicate the workplace. Noise levels, production flow, interruptions and time variances must be typical of those experienced in the general information and communications technology (ICT) industry, and include access to:

- a personal computer (PC) and printer
- software currently used in industry
- documents detailing organisational style guide and policy
- documents or information containing data suitable for developing software application documents.

Assessors must satisfy NVR/AQTF assessor requirements.
