Performance Evidence

Evidence of the ability to:

- analyse and critically evaluate features and functions of identified industry specific technologies to an industry standard
- manage the implementation of new and emerging industry specific technologies
- review the performance of the industry specific technologies for the organisation.

Note: If a specific volume or frequency is not stated, then evidence must be provided at least once.

Knowledge Evidence

To complete the unit requirements safely and effectively, the individual must:

- describe the trends and applications of current vendor products and technologies
- outline the various techniques for gathering information
- discuss the current directions of information and communications technology (ICT) and specifically of the major industry technology standards used in the specified area
- summarise the general features, capabilities and application of current industry hardware and software products.

Assessment Conditions

Gather evidence to demonstrate consistent performance in conditions that are safe and replicate the workplace. Noise levels, production flow, interruptions and time variances must be typical of those experienced in the general ICT industry, and include access to:

- a site where industry specific technologies may be used
- industry specific technologies currently used in industry
- documents detailing work health and safety (WHS) standards, environmental guidelines and organisational requirements.

Assessors must satisfy NVR/AQTF assessor requirements.
