## Performance Evidence

Evidence of the ability to:

- design, implement, manage and finalise a complex information and communications technology (ICT) project
- manage planning processes, scheduling, human resources, reporting and response to contingencies
- align projects with organisational strategies and requirements
- assess outcomes and provide recommendations that will refine and improve future ICT project management processes.

Note: If a specific volume or frequency is not stated, then evidence must be provided at least once.

## Knowledge Evidence

To complete the unit requirements safely and effectively, the individual must:

- explain the concepts of risk management planning and processes
- outline computer software functions and operation, including relevant proprietary software
- identify relevant current legislation, codes and standards
- explain sustainability requirements and ratings, including:
  - reporting mechanisms
  - conservation of energy
  - management of other resources
- explain tools and models of project management
- identify and explain organisational frameworks and functions, including:
  - enterprises
  - government bodies
  - industry associations.

## Assessment Conditions

Gather evidence to demonstrate consistent performance in conditions that are safe and replicate the workplace. Noise levels, production flow, interruptions and time variances must be typical of those experienced in the ICT project management field of work and include access to:

- relevant computer software packages
- suitable hardware
- codes, standards and legislation relevant to the jurisdiction and the project
- project documentation
- research resources, including product information and data, theoretical texts and other information.

Assessors must satisfy NVR/AQTF assessor requirements.
