Unit Descriptor

Unit descriptor This unit covers the skills and knowledge to perform the tasks associated with finishing of headwear and involves final inspection.

Application of the Unit

Application of the Unit

The unit applies to activities associated with undertaking finishing operations on headwear and related articles.

Work is conducted according to defined procedures.

Work may be conducted in small to large scale enterprises and may involve individual and team activities

The application of this unit is according to OHS practices of the enterprise and workplace practices, which may include:

- requirements prescribed by legislation, awards, agreements and conditions of employment
- standard operating procedures
- work instructions
- oral, written and visual communication
- quality practices, including responsibility for maintenance of own work quality and contribution to quality improvement of team or section output
- housekeeping
- tasks related to environmental protection, waste disposal, pollution control, and recycling

This unit requires the application of skills associated with planning and organising to perform finishing of clothing. Problem solving skills are required to ensure work conforms to requirements and identify any production problems. Communication skills are used to refer to and complete required documentation. Self management skills are used to ensure safe use of technology and conformance of own work to quality standards.

3 Finish headwear	3.1 Headwear is finished for presentation by brushing, steaming or pressing. 3.2 Final inspection of headwear is assessed to ensure conformance to quality and safety standards. 3.3 Non-conformance to standards is identified and appropriate action taken. 3.4 OHS practices are followed. 3.5 Action is taken according to OHS practices to prevent accidents and to eliminate risks to personal safety.
4 Maintain records	4.1 Finished article and non-conformance records and reports are accurately maintained.

Required Skills and Knowledge

This describes the essential skills and knowledge and their level, required for this unit.

Demonstrates knowledge of:

- industry and product processes and equipment
- finishing processes and their application to different fabrics
- inspection and checking procedures
- quality standards and practices
- Safety and environmental aspects related to machine operation and use of tools/equipment, and the importance of ventilation and lighting
- OHS practices, including hazard identification and control measures
- workplace practices
- recording and reporting practices

Demonstrates skills to:

- apply a range of finishing techniques
- identify and select relevant labels and instructions
- carry out inspection processes on a range of different headwear products
- use and handle chemicals appropriately
- apply the quality requirements for each stage of the process
- document, assess and transfer information
- read, interpret and follow information on work specifications, standard operating procedures and work instructions, and other reference material
- maintain accurate records
- communicate within the workplace
- sequence operations
- meet specifications
- clarify and check task-related information
- carry out work according to OHS practices

OHS practices OHS practices include hazard identification and control, risk assessment and implementation of risk reduction measures specific to the tasks described by this unit, and may relate to:

- manual handling techniques
- standard operating procedures
- personal protective equipment
- safe materials handling
- taking of rest breaks
- ergonomic arrangement of workplaces
- following marked walkways
- safe storage of equipment
- housekeeping
- reporting accidents and incidents
- environmental practices
