Application

This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to apply hand skills and use maintenance documentation to dismantle, inspect, maintain and assemble aircraft mechanical components or parts during scheduled or unscheduled maintenance under the guidance of a qualified person. Work under the guidance of a qualified person may be performed individually or as part of a team.

This unit applies to components or parts either attached to the aircraft or in a workshop. It does not include work on hydraulic and pneumatic components or parts. Maintenance includes cleaning, inspection for wear or damage and routine adjustment and lubrication where applicable in accordance with enterprise procedures.

Note that the scope of any repair or modification and the procedure to be followed will be provided by the qualified person, and be within the scope of the skills and knowledge included in the unit of competency MEA158 Perform basic hand skills, standard trade practices and fundamentals in aviation maintenance

The unit is used in workplaces that operate under the airworthiness regulatory systems of the Civil Aviation Safety Authority (CASA) and the Defence Aviation Safety Authority (DASA).

Any other relevant legislation, industry standards and codes of practice within Australia must be applied.

Prepare to dismantle, inspect, maintain and assemble basic mechanical components or parts	1.1 Remove or disassemble components in accordance with enterprise procedures, relevant maintenance documentation and qualified person guidance while observing all relevant work health and safety (WHS) requirements, including the use of material safety data sheets (MSDSs) and items of personal protective equipment (PPE) 1.2 Confirm maintenance or repair requirements as defined by the qualified person, enterprise procedures and the relevant maintenance documentation 1.3 Specify tagging and repair instructions in accordance with enterprise procedures and qualified person directions for parts requiring specialist repair 1.4 Select and prepare appropriate materials, tools, equipment and assembly or fabrication jigs, where applicable, for the maintenance and repair requirements in accordance with enterprise procedures and relevant maintenance documentation

Maintain or repair mechanical components or parts	2.1 Carry out routine maintenance, repair or modification procedures in accordance with manufacturers' bulletins, required enterprise procedures and specifications while observing all relevant WHS requirements, including the use of MSDSs and items of PPE 2.2 Assemble mechanical component parts within specified tolerances in accordance with enterprise procedures and the appropriate maintenance documents 2.3 Provide assistance where applicable and when required by the qualified person in the final adjustment of components to confirm serviceability
3. Complete maintenance or repair activities	3.1 Complete required documentation and process in accordance with standard enterprise procedures 3.2 Tag, seal and pack components within specified procedures

Foundation Skills
