Application

This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to apply knowledge of gas tungsten arc welding (GTAW) processes to welding applicable aircraft parent metal groups as specified by the regulators during scheduled or unscheduled maintenance. Work may be performed individually or as part of a team.

The unit is used in workplaces that operate under the airworthiness regulatory systems of the Civil Aviation Safety Authority (CASA) and the Defence Aviation Safety Authority (DASA).

The unit covers the development of competency elements required to gain approval within the Civil Aviation Safety Authority (CASA) or Defence Aviation Safety Authority (DASA) regulatory systems to weld aircraft components using the gas metal arc welding (GMAW) process. Individuals will be authorised to weld specific parent metal groups, as specified in CAAP 33-1(1) Aircraft manual welding: approvals and qualifications.

Any other relevant legislation, industry standards and codes of practice within Australia must be applied.

Foundation Skills
