3. Participate in maintaining own welder continuity	3.1 Monitor own pre-qualification against relevant standards, codes and weld procedure specifications (WPS) 3.2 Contribute welder pre-qualification data for validation and entry into welder logs or other like records

Foundation Skills

Range of Conditions

Weld record keeping requirements include one or more of the following:	• welder identification • WPS and standards related to the welding performed • welder pre-qualification and continuity information • welding supervisor • weld bay/location in the enterprise • job number or other job identifier • date welds performed • any pre or post weld heat treatment • equipment, material and consumables used • basic non-destructive testing (NDT) and other tests performed by the welder • weld non-conformities and faults and record of corrective or preventative actions taken • other non-conformances • other records required by the enterprise welding record management quality system data.
Enterprise weld record systems include one or more of the following:	• PC based records using standard spreadsheet or word processing software • PC based records using dedicated weld record software programs • electronic records using cloud based dedicated weld record software programs • welding parameter data gathered automatically by the welding machine, handheld recording devices connected or loaded to welding software • paper or microfiche record systems.
Welding parameters include one or more of the following:	• material specification and grade • material preparation requirements • joint details • process type • position • run sequence and pass number • welding process • filler material • material diameter • current • voltage • polarity • wire feed speed • travel speed • pre and post heat input.
Individual job and	• job commencement and conclusion

welding time data includes one or more of the following:	• commencement and conclusion times for each joint weld • on arc time • pre and post heat time and date.
