Application

This unit of competency was developed for post trade engineering fabrication training and the recognition of post trade skills in advanced weld repairs and weld maintenance.

It defines the skills and knowledge required to restore or extend the original fatigue life of a cracked component including advanced weld repair and maintenance on both ferrous and non-ferrous metals, assessment of cracks or defects, removal of cracks, repair weld preparation and performing repair welds as defined in the unit in combination with its prerequisites.

The unit scope includes required welding and material knowledge and skills, knowledge of relevant welding standards, welding terminology and welder qualification requirements

Where the welding associated with this unit also requires the application of welding to codes and standards, the unit MEM05062 Apply welding and welding related codes and standards must also be selected. Weld repairs and weld maintenance performed using the skills and knowledge in this unit may or may not be performed in accordance with a weld procedure specification (WPS). Where the welding associated with this unit also requires the welding to be undertaken according to a formal WPS, the unit MEM05068 Apply weld procedure specifications must also be selected.

Foundation Skills

This section describes those language, literacy, numeracy and employment skills that are essential to performance.

Foundation skills essential to performance are explicit in the performance criteria of this unit of competency.

Range of Conditions

This field allows for different work environments and conditions that may affect performance. Essential operating conditions that may be present (depending on the work situation, needs of the candidate, accessibility of the item, and local industry and regional contexts) are included.

Weld repairs covered by repair specifications or pre-approval requirements include one or more of the following:	- original equipment manufacturer (OEM) specific instructions for weld repairs - equipment is covered by regulatory provisions relating to repair and/or inspection procedures - regulatory or customer requirement for repairs to be performed by coded welders - material is an alloy steel (high strength and/or high alloy) - material is under high stress and/or load or has no redundancy - the repair is a highly complex/difficult repair.
Weld crack or defect parameters include one or more of the following:	- weld cracks including: - fillet weld toe crack or cap crack - reinforcement plate or wear plate crack - transverse crack through fillet weld - multiple, complex or branching cracks - internal cracks - crack location and crack dimensions - corrosion - wear.

Weld repair includes one or more of the following welding processes:	• gas metal arc welding (GMAW) • manual metal arc welding (MMAW) • flux core arc welding (FCAW) • gas tungsten arc welding (GTAW).
Basic tests to determine weldability include one or more of the following:	• grinding sparks • hardness • lustre • magnetism.
Weld removal methods include one or more of the following:	• carbon arc gouging • arc gouging • plasma gouging • oxy/fuel gouging • grinding • chipping.
Welding parameters include one or more of the following:	• material preparation • joint detail • position • run sequence and pass number • welding process • filler material • flux • current • voltage • polarity • wire feed speed where relevant • travel speed • pre and post-heat input in accordance with SOPs.
Advanced weld repair may be performed on one or more of the following materials:	• cast metal • carbon steel • low alloy steel • stainless steel • aluminium • other non-ferrous metals and alloys.
Blending and dressing of welds:	blending and dressing of welds means altering the shape of the weld cap and/or toe to provide a smooth contour or transition. This may be done using various abrasive tools such as grinding discs, flap discs, stones, burrs etc.
