Application

This unit of competency has been developed for post trade engineering fabrication training and the recognition of post trade skills in applying welding principles to welding that is generally associated with the application of one of the MEM Manufacturing and Engineering Training Package units satisfying AS 1796 Certification of welders and welding supervisors, or equivalent.

It defines the skills and knowledge required to review job specifications requiring coded welding and plan for the welding preparation, sequencing and set up of welds required to satisfy AS 1796 Certification of welders and welding supervisors. The unit includes knowledge of welding terms, codes and symbols and set up requirements for a range of materials and processes as defined in the unit in conjunction with its prerequisites.

Where metallurgical skills and knowledge to support coded welding, welding supervision, or welding inspection are required, the unit MEM05061 Apply basic metallurgy principles to welding applications must be selected.

This unit must be selected in combination with one of the units satisfying the AS 1796 Certification of welders and welding supervisors or equivalent. These units include:

- MEM05079 Perform welds to code standards using flux core arc welding process
- MEM05080 Perform welds to code standards using gas metal arc welding process
- MEM05081 Perform welds to code standards using gas tungsten arc welding process
- MEM05082 Perform pipe welds to code standards using manual metal arc welding process
- MEM05083 Perform welds to code standards using manual metal arc welding process
- MEM05088 Perform welds to code standards using oxy fuel gas welding process
- MEM05060 Perform welds to code standards using submerged arc welding process.

No licensing, legislative or certification requirements apply to this unit at the time of publication.

Welding is to AS 1796 Certification of welders and welding supervisors or equivalent and includes one or more of the following:	• flux core arc welding (FCAW) • gas metal arc welding (GMAW) • gas tungsten arc welding (GTAW) • manual metal arc welding (MMAW) • submerged arc welding (SAW) • oxy fuel gas welding.
Processes to support required welding include one or more of the following:	• cutting, bevelling and assembly of plates and components for welding • pre-welding heat treatment • post-welding heat treatment • stress relieving • use of backing bars, plates and rings • normalising and annealing.
